Students will use a variety of drawing materials and will keep their own sketchbook throughout class. Raku and You (Making and Firing Raku Pottery)

Students will learn about traditional Japanese Raku pottery and the cha-no-yu Japanese tea ceremony as well as contemporary Raku ceramic artists such as Paul Soldner. Students will also learn to create their own Japanese tea bowls and rice bowls using traditional Japanese wheel throwing techniques including throw-

ing off the hump and Japanese throwing sticks.

Perhaps the most thrilling aspect of Raku is participating in the process of firing your own pots. During the final class students will glaze and fire their ware using special Raku glazes and firing methods. The Raku firing process is completed in about one hour, so when you leave you will be able to take your finished pottery with you.

It's the Pits (Making and Firing Pots in the Pre-Columbian Tradition)

Students will create coil pottery in the tradition of the Pre-Columbian cultures such as the Aztecs, Incas, and Mayas and Pueblo Pottery in the tradition of Native American Indian cultures such as the Anasazi, Acoma, Zuni, and Hopi. Students will form and decorate their wares utilizing traditional techniques such as coiling, paddling, burnishing, incising and carving, stamping and impressing, and polychrome painting. Traditional tools that may be brought with you include a flat board or paddle to help shape the coil pots (this may be wrapped with rope to add texture to the surface), shells for smoothing and scraping, smooth stones for burnishing and a bowl or dish to be used as the "puka" to form the pottery in. During the final class students will participate in a traditional pit firing similar to that used to thousands of years by primitive cultures all over the world.

Traditional slip decorating techniques will also be demonstrated so that you can add color, pattern, and design to your creations. Class cost includes 30 lbs of clay (a \$37.50 value). 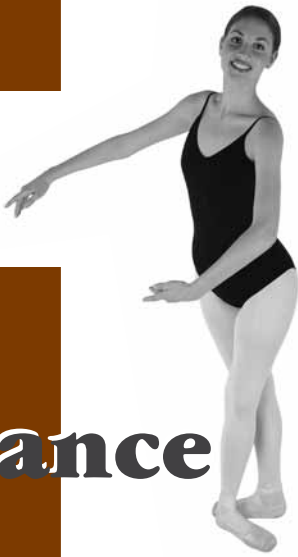
