Musikgarten

Musikgarten music and movement curriculum for parents and children is directed toward an aural development of the child through activities designed to nurture a loving musical bond between parent and child. Because Musikgarten is an aural music education curriculum, the purchase of materials allows the child and parent to listen at home to the music used in class and is a necessary part of the program.
